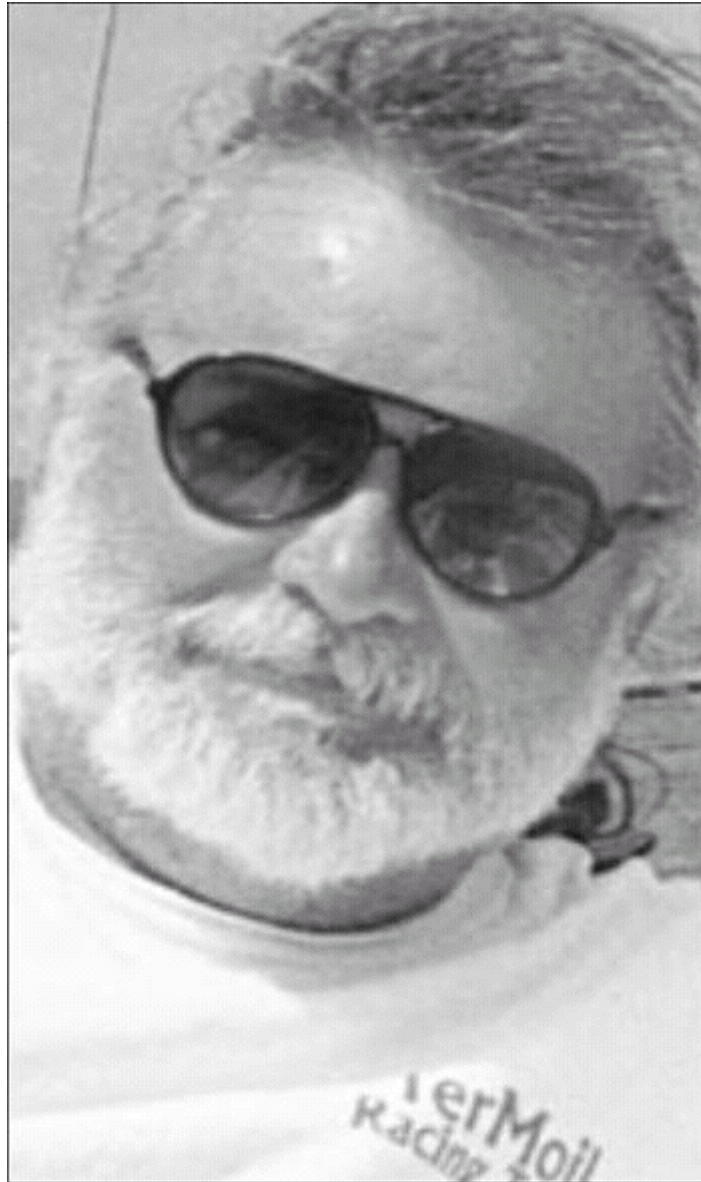

In Memory of Rod L. TerBeest



Rod L. TerBeest, age 60 of Madison Lake passed away on Sunday, December 21, 2008, at Immanuel St. Joseph's Hospital in Mankato. Rod was born on June 21, 1948, in Wycoff, MN to Russell and Helen (Plumber) TerBeest. He graduated from Harmony high school in 1966 and from Minnesota State University in Mankato. In his earlier years he was employed at KEYC in Mankato and since the 1980's was owner of Rod TerBeest Productions. Rod was a member of the Lake City Yacht Club, the president of Holder 20 One Design sailing class, and the Mankato Chamber of Commerce. He enjoyed wood working, movies and especially sailing. Grateful for having shared his life are his children: Elizabeth (Christopher) Luehder of Bozeman, MT and Benjamin (Tammi) TerBeest of Pemberton; step-children: Melissa Seitzer of Mankato and Nathaniel Seitzer of Minneapolis; grandchildren: Olivia and Rowen Luehder, and Vanessa and Zander TerBeest; siblings: Charlene Kudla TerBeest, David TerBeest, Theodore TerBeest, Mariella Schladweiler and Jennifer TerBeest; mother-in-law Mary Lue Brinker and many other relatives. He will be sadly missed by all of us.

Holder 20 One Design 2008 National Championship Lake Pepin, Minnesota

Congratulations to the 2008 Holder 20 One Design National Champions Jim Donadio, Mike Hayes & Tim Carlson. 2nd place went Matt Gundlach, 3rd place went to Jim Rosaschi, Fred deSousa & Mark Jonesy, 4th place went to Rod TerBeest, Kim Spears & Mark Swanson, & 5th place went to Joe Horan & crew.

Nine Holder 20 One Design sailboats were on the starting line for the 2008 National Championship regatta at Lake City Yacht Club on Minnesota's Lake Pepin. Jim Rosaschi traveled from Las Vegas, Nevada, and Joe Horan traveled from Wisconsin to join the fun. Windy and rough sea conditions shortened the 2008 Holder 20 OD National Championship to just 3 races on the first day and abandonment of all races on the second day. The wind was blowing 15 – 20 for the first race of the windward/leeward course. Most boats flew 155 genoas, but Jim Donadio, Mike Hayes and Tim Carlson, changed down to their 135 genoa and was able to keep #111 flat and fast and easily won the first race, TerBeest was 2nd, and Rosaschi 3rd. By the second race the wind was up to 20 – 25 with everyone changing down a notch and with #111 going to the blade and the rest changing to 135 genoas. Boat handling, a good start, and correct course selection were all #111 needed to win race 2 handily, with Joe Horan 2nd and Jim Rosaschi

3rd. By the third race the wind was gusting up to 36 MPH and everyone was in survival mode, with #111 winning again but by a much closer margin, the top 4 boats were within seconds of each other at the finish. After the third race on Saturday, the race committee abandoned all racing for the rest of the day.

The Lake City Yacht Club open Skiff Fleet which was also racing on the same course sponsored a brats and potato salad party on the deck of the LCYC clubhouse on Saturday Night. Our thanks to Allen Rech and Bruce Santerre of the LCYC for hosting the Holder 20 One Design fleet and the Lake City Marina and Mark Lutjen for accommodating the fleet in the marina.

On Sunday Morning the Committee Boat went out to set the buoys for the Sunday races. By 10 am the wind was already up to 25 MPH, the skiff fleet cancelled all racing for the day, by 11 am the wind was up to 30 MPH and the Holder 20 fleet captain, consulting with the race committee, abandoned the racing for the day and called it a regatta.

Several of the boats were sailing with family crew including: Dan and Brian Lein, Jim Rogers with daughter Michelle and her husband Tom from the Madison Lake Sailing Club, and Dave and Lynette Sorrentino from the Waconia Yacht Club.

One Design sailing is so critical when sailing competitively. When you order new sails, you should make sure the sail

maker uses the Holder20 One Design specs. There are no restrictions on the sail material, only the spec sizing from the spinnaker, main, jib and genoa. Visit our website or call me if you have any questions about the sizing. Any modified sail that is not to the specs of the One-Design Class rules is an illegal sail when sailing in one-design classes.

If you do have an over size sail and are racing PHRF against other Holders that don't, you **MUST** take a penalty. You will only be hurting your area of ratings for the Holder20. The average rating for the Holder20 is 186. Please stick to your Holder20 One Design rules and if you have any questions or concerns about this issue, please give me call.

Holder 20 One-Design Sizing

The Holder20 One Design Class Association uses PHRF sizing. Below are the specs as written in the Class rules.

MAINSAIL

The mainsail mid-girth shall not exceed 6.58' (6'7") and $\frac{3}{4}$ girth shall not exceed 3.84' (3'10").

The sail shall have four battens of any length.

A reef point and flattening reef are permitted.

A cunningham hole may be fitted in the luff.

A leech line is permitted.

The maximum LP shall not exceed 100% of the "J Measurement".

Reefing attachment points or devices may be fitted.

The leech shall be convex.

The leech may have a maximum of three battens.

A leech line is permitted.

Camber lines are permitted.

155% GENOA

The maximum LP shall not exceed 155% of the "J Measurement".

The leech shall not be convex.

A leech line is permitted.

Camber lines are permitted.

A 140% is also used.

SPINNAKER

The spinnaker shall be a three-cornered sail, symmetrical about its centerline.

The sail, laid out on a flat surface, shall be measured when folded in half about its centerline, with the leeches superimposed. Sufficient tension shall be applied to remove wrinkles and creases along the line of measurement.

The length of the leeches shall not exceed 22'6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (687mm).

The spinnaker maximum width shall not exceed 180% of the "J Measurement".
